Yuba County Superior Court Suspends All Non-Essential Functions for Duration of “Shelter in Place” Order

Superior Court of California, County of Yuba has suspended all non-essential functions through April 30, 2020. **Please check the court’s website on a regular basis to determine what calendars and hearings will be conducted.** During this time the Court strongly encourages the practice of social distancing and the use of Zoom to make video appearances as authorized by the Chief Justice emergency orders or CourtCall (**1-888-88-COURT**) to appear telephonically, as permitted by law under California Rules of Court, rule 3.670, whenever possible.

Through April 30, 2020, only the following functions will be conducted by the court:

- a. Civil Harassment Restraining Orders.
- b. Domestic Violence Restraining Orders.
- c. Probate Emergency Petitions for Temporary Conservatorship.
- d. Probate Emergency Petition for Temporary Guardianships.
- e. Search Warrants.
- f. In Custody Arraignments and Prehearing Conferences.
- g. No Time Waiver Criminal Preliminary Hearings.
- h. Bail Review.
- j. No Time Waiver Criminal Sentencings.
- k. Juvenile Protective Custody Warrants.
- l. Juvenile Delinquency in custody, no time waiver detention, jurisdictional and disposition hearings. Minors and parents may appear via Zoom.
- m. Juvenile Dependency detention, jurisdictional, disposition and review hearings requiring federally mandated reasonable/active efforts findings. The Court asks that children not be transported to the court for dependency proceedings. Parents may appear via Zoom.
- n. Emergency Child Custody Hearings.
- o. Hearings on Petition for Gun Violence Restraining Orders.

Unlawful Detainers/Judicial Foreclosures: Pursuant to the emergency orders granted by the Judicial Council on April 6, 2020, the issuance of summons and entry of default and default judgments on unlawful detainer complaints are suspended and trials on any unlawful detainer actions in which a defendant has appeared more than 60 days after the request for such trial, unless the court finds that earlier action is needed to protect public health and safety. Judicial foreclosure actions are stayed until 90 days after the Governor declares that the state of emergency related to COVID-19 pandemic is lifted.
